Church Guidelines for the "New Normal"

1) Arriving at Church

Please do not come to church if you, or anyone you live with, has symptoms such as a fever, a new cough, difficulty breathing, loss of sense of smell, etc.

Please do not come to church if you have been told to quarantine by the doctor or because of travel.

Please arrive early for the service as this will help us get everyone in and seated on time for church to start. The building will be open from 11:30am.

Only one family at a time can be in the porch. We will check your temperature on the way in, if you have a temperature above 37.5°C the HSE recommends that you do not attend.

If you are able to, please wear a facemask. It might seem strange at first but facemasks have been proven to help reduce the spread of viruses and you will be protecting your fellow churchgoers as well as yourself.

Please use the hand gel provided and follow the instructions of the stewards who will show you to your seats. Once in your seats please respect other families and do not move around the room unnecessarily.

Please make sure we have up to date contact details for you in case we have to provide it for contact tracing.

2) During the service

There will be no community singing for the next few weeks but there will still be music in the church services.

There will be no offering collected but there will be offering plates at the entrance where you can give your donation. Standing order forms are available at the front of the church.

3) After the service

Please follow the stewards advice and allow people to leave church from the back first so that there will be no crowding at the door.

There were will be no tea and coffee served after the service.
